to lead a new research and capacity building program initiative for **"Policy Analysis on Growth and Employment" (PAGE)** in developing countries.

The 3rd PAGE call for proposals is now officially launched!

Deadline for submission is **October 30, 2014**

To build and promote research capacities in developing countries

In accordance with PEP's core mission, this initiative includes an important capacity building component, and targets teams of researchers based in developing countries. Selected teams will benefit from the unique and manifold [PEP support program](#) in the conduct of high-quality research projects.

For this particular initiative, priority is given to researchers from and based in **low-income countries (LICs), fragile and/or conflict states** – see [list of targeted countries](#) – but proposals from all developing countries are welcome.

For the analysis of specific and country-relevant policy issues

For each of the annual PAGE calls for proposals, a different [list of priority issues](#) - under the broad theme of inclusive growth and employment - are identified as especially relevant to address specific knowledge gaps and policy needs.

The priority issues identified for this 3rd (and final) PAGE round are:

- **Improving the targeting of public expenditures and social assistance**
- **Design of minimum wage policies and impact on youth and female workers**
- **Youth employment**
- **Inclusiveness of growth : the role of labor markets**
- **Natural resources and employment**
- **Micro and small enterprises for economic empowerment and poverty reduction**

In the context of this call, PEP will support projects of policy analysis using either of the following approaches/methods:

- Macro-micro policy simulations (using CGE models)
- Impact evaluations*
- Microeconomic measurement & analysis

*Projects involving data collection (e.g. CBMS or RCTs) will not be supported in this round, with the exception of those selected in the context of the:

"special call for field experiments"
